## S SHOPPING

Jonker Street (Jalan Hang Jebat) and Jalan Tun Tan Cheng Lock are known for great antique finds. The charming rows of Peranakan (Straits Chinese) shop houses that line these roads are said to contain some of the best antiques in the country such as furniture, ceramics, crockery, jewellery, trinkets, old currencies, costumes and paintings, among others.

Visitors can also find a variety of souvenirs such as T-shirts, mugs, keychains, pottery, traditional Peranakan footwear, clothing and other handcrafted items – some of which can be personalised to your liking in the Jonker Street area (Jalan Tun Tan Cheng Lock, Lorong Hang Jebat, Jalan Hang Lekir). To try making your own clay products, join the clay workshop at the Clay House located at Jalan Tukang Emas. To shop for popular brands, head to malls such as Dataran Pahlawan, Melaka Megamall, Melaka Parade, AEON Melaka Shopping Centre, Elements Mall, AEON Mall Bandaraya Melaka, The Shore Shopping Gallery and Freeport A' Famosa Outlet.



# Melaka

Strategically located along the Straits of Malacca, Melaka was once the epicentre of an important trading empire, which attracted thousands of traders from all over the world. Historical buildings and sites abound in Melaka, the birthplace of the nation's historical and cultural heritage.

Remnants of its long and illustrious past under the successive rule of the Portuguese, Dutch and British are well-preserved and can still be seen today, earning it the prestigious title of a UNESCO World Heritage City in 2008. Beyond the historical crowd-pullers are scenic rustic settlements and a rich cultural landscape.



Malaysian Railway or Keretapi Tanah Melayu Berhad (KTMB) operates regular train services from various parts of the country to Tampin and vice-versa. KTMB's Tampin / Pulau Sebang Station is situated approximately 38km from Melaka City.

Melaka is accessible by sea from Dumai, Indonesia. Visitors arriving by sea will disembark at the Melaka International Ferry Terminal in Taman Kota Laksamana. The journey from Dumai takes about 2 ½ hours.

## D DINING

Melaka's unique cultures are reflected in its cuisine. Stalls selling all types of local specialities – Malay, Nyonya, Chinese, Portuguese and Chitty fare – line Jonker Street at night with their mouth-watering offerings. Other popular places where one can find a good selection of local specialities include Melaka Raya, Bandar Hilir and Jalan Munshi Abdullah. Among the must-try local dishes include Asam Pedas Melaka, Satay Celup, Chicken Rice Balls and Kembuli Rice.

## POI PLACES OF INTEREST



**MELAKA SULTANATE PALACE MUSEUM**  
The replica of Sultan Mansur Shah's palace at the foot of St. Paul's Hill was built based on the information and data obtained from the Malay Annals. The architectural style follows the original structure where no nails were used. The museum is a great place to learn about Melaka's long and illustrious past with more than 1,300 historical items on display.

**MARITIME MUSEUM**  
Also known as Flor de la Mar, the museum is fashioned after the Portuguese ship that sank off the coast of Melaka. With paintings and exhibits detailing the maritime history of Melaka, the museum also displays porcelain, textiles, spices and even sunken treasures taken off Diana, another shipwreck.

**CHRIST CHURCH**  
Built by the Dutch in 1753, this is one of Melaka's most iconic buildings. It stands beside The Stadthuys. The cathedral has a Brass Bible, 200-year-old handmade pews, decorative fanlights and plaques that honour Dutch soldiers and locals. Christ Church is one of the oldest functioning churches in Southeast Asia, and continues to conduct weekly services.



**CHURCH OF ST. FRANCIS XAVIER**  
Completed in 1856, the church was named in honour of St. Francis Xavier who was famed throughout Asia for his tireless efforts in propagating the Roman Catholic faith. He was based in Melaka on and off for several years from 1545. St. Francis died in 1552 as he was travelling to China. His body was brought to Melaka before being laid to rest at the Basilica of Born Jesus in Goa.



**VILLA SENTOSA, KAMPUNG MORTEN**  
Kampung Morten, with its beautiful traditional Malaccan houses, is a visual feast. The most prominent abode in this village is Villa Sentosa, which was built in the 1920s. The house is a museum of sorts with a varied collection of artefacts including Ming dynasty ceramics and a 100-year-old copy of the Quran. Situated along the Melaka River, Kampung Morten can be reached via a bridge just opposite the Majestic Hotel.

**BABA & NYONYA HERITAGE MUSEUM**  
Once the ancestral home of three generations of a Baba Nyonya family, the Baba and Nyonya Heritage Museum offers a glimpse into the life of a wealthy Straits Chinese family, otherwise known as the Peranakan people, who are descendants of the earliest Chinese migrants to Melaka.

**TAMING SARI TOWER**  
Malaysia's gyro tower stands at a height of 110m and revolves 360 degrees, providing a panoramic view of Bandar Melaka. Its name is inspired by Keris Taming Sari, the mythical weapon belonging to the legendary Malay warrior, Hang Tuah. Attached to the tower are five commercial outlets including a restaurant, café and souvenir outlets.

**MELAKA DUCK TOURS**  
This tour takes visitors around Melaka's coastline by land and sea on an amphibian. This is also the first and the only such tour in Malaysia. Passengers (called 'ducks') get to sail the Straits of Malacca up to Pulau Melaka (Melaka Island) and enjoy impressive views of the Floating Mosque and the Melaka Marina.



**PRISON MUSEUM**  
Housed in an actual former prison, this museum chronicles the beginning of a prison system in the country and its development over the years. It also creates awareness on the prisons' role in rehabilitating offenders. The museum was set up after the Banda Hilir Prison was vacated in 2010. A visit here gives the rare opportunity of entering prison cells and viewing objects such as inmates' uniforms, canes and the hangman's noose. Particularly interesting is the façade of Pudu Jail, relocated from Kuala Lumpur, after the jail was demolished.

**ENCORE MELAKA**  
A showcase of Melaka's heritage and culture, Encore Melaka presents fascinating performances through a series of touching local life stories. The 70-minute show chronicles the historic city, from the stories of the early voyagers to the birth of modern Melaka, through songs and performances. Encore Melaka is touted to be Southeast Asia's largest permanent show theater that boasts innovative and stunning video projection mapping with a multi-stage hydraulic set with advance lighting. It also features a 360-degree rotating audience platform.



**SUBMARINE MUSEUM**  
Located at Dataran 1Malaysia in Klebang, Melaka's Submarine Museum is the first and only submarine museum in Malaysia. The 'museum' is actually a decommissioned Agosta 70 class submarine named SMID Quessant from France. Measuring 67.57 m in length, it was previously used to train submarine crew in Malaysia. In its heyday, it was widely regarded as a formidable weapon.

**HANG TUAH CENTRE**  
Hang Tuah Centre chronicles the life of Hang Tuah, the legendary Malay warrior, as told by the Malay Annals and Hikayat Hang Tuah. The complex comprises a cluster of five traditional Malaccan Malay houses representing the five famous warriors during the era of Sultan Mansur Shah – Hang Tuah, Hang Jebat, Hang Kasturi, Hang Lekir and Hang Lekiu. The centre is located in Kampung Sungai Duyong, where Hang Tuah was born.

**THE SHORE SKY TOWER**  
Situated in the vicinity of tourist attractions such as Kampung Morten, this is a great place to enjoy the view of Melaka city by day and night. PROCLAMATION OF INDEPENDENCE MEMORIAL

The Proclamation of Independence Memorial is so named because the announcement of Malaysia's impending independence was made by Tunku Abdul Rahman Putra Al-Haj, Malaysia's first Prime Minister, at Padang Pahlawan just across the road. This former colonial building now houses an exhibition that traces the nation's journey to independence. Films that feature this historic event are regularly shown at the theatrette.

PORTA DE SANTIAGO (A'FAMOSA FORT)

Porta de Santiago is one of the four main entrances to the A'Famosa fortress, which was built in 1511 by Alfonso d' Albuquerque, a Portuguese admiral. Even though the rest of the fortress was badly damaged during the Dutch invasion in 1641, its iconic gateway still stands to this day. The fort was saved in time from being demolished by Sir Stamford Raffles, who had a strong passion for history.

DUTCH SQUARE

A must-visit attraction, Dutch Square is surrounded by iconic red painted buildings. It represents the history of Melaka, from the Dutch administration (The Stadthuys and Christ Church), the British colonisation (Queen Victoria's Fountain), as well as the Chinese settlers of Melaka, (reflected by the Tan Beng Swee Clock Tower) which was built in honour of a generous Chinese tycoon.

THE STADTHUYS

Characterised by salmon red walls, The Stadthuys was once the official residence of the Dutch governors and their officers. The building is a fine example of Dutch woodworking and masonry, and presently houses the History and Ethnography Museum as well as the Literature Museum. Built in 1645, The Stadthuys is the oldest remaining Dutch building in Southeast Asia.

## GT GETTING THERE

Melaka is situated approximately 144km from Kuala Lumpur, 90km from Port Dickson and 224km from Johor Bahru. Melaka International Airport is located in Batu Berendam, approximately 10km from Melaka City (State Capital). If you're driving, the North-South Expressway runs through the state and provides easy access to its attractions, which are located near the Simpang Ampat, Ayer Keroh and Lipat Kajang exits. Melaka Sentral, the new bus and taxi terminal in Peringgit, is roughly 6km from the city.

Malaysian Railway or Keretapi Tanah Melayu Berhad (KTMB) operates regular train services from various parts of the country to Tampin and vice-versa. KTMB's Tampin / Pulau Sebang Station is situated approximately 38km from Melaka City.

Melaka is accessible by sea from Dumai, Indonesia. Visitors arriving by sea will disembark at the Melaka International Ferry Terminal in Taman Kota Laksamana. The journey from Dumai takes about 2 ½ hours.

## POI PLACES OF INTEREST



**MELAKA SULTANATE PALACE MUSEUM**  
The replica of Sultan Mansur Shah's palace at the foot of St. Paul's Hill was built based on the information and data obtained from the Malay Annals. The architectural style follows the original structure where no nails were used. The museum is a great place to learn about Melaka's long and illustrious past with more than 1,300 historical items on display.

**MARITIME MUSEUM**  
Also known as Flor de la Mar, the museum is fashioned after the Portuguese ship that sank off the coast of Melaka. With paintings and exhibits detailing the maritime history of Melaka, the museum also displays porcelain, textiles, spices and even sunken treasures taken off Diana, another shipwreck.

**CHRIST CHURCH**  
Built by the Dutch in 1753, this is one of Melaka's most iconic buildings. It stands beside The Stadthuys. The cathedral has a Brass Bible, 200-year-old handmade pews, decorative fanlights and plaques that honour Dutch soldiers and locals. Christ Church is one of the oldest functioning churches in Southeast Asia, and continues to conduct weekly services.



**CHURCH OF ST. FRANCIS XAVIER**  
Completed in 1856, the church was named in honour of St. Francis Xavier who was famed throughout Asia for his tireless efforts in propagating the Roman Catholic faith. He was based in Melaka on and off for several years from 1545. St. Francis died in 1552 as he was travelling to China. His body was brought to Melaka before being laid to rest at the Basilica of Born Jesus in Goa.



**VILLA SENTOSA, KAMPUNG MORTEN**  
Kampung Morten, with its beautiful traditional Malaccan houses, is a visual feast. The most prominent abode in this village is Villa Sentosa, which was built in the 1920s. The house is a museum of sorts with a varied collection of artefacts including Ming dynasty ceramics and a 100-year-old copy of the Quran. Situated along the Melaka River, Kampung Morten can be reached via a bridge just opposite the Majestic Hotel.

**BABA & NYONYA HERITAGE MUSEUM**  
Once the ancestral home of three generations of a Baba Nyonya family, the Baba and Nyonya Heritage Museum offers a glimpse into the life of a wealthy Straits Chinese family, otherwise known as the Peranakan people, who are descendants of the earliest Chinese migrants to Melaka.

**TAMING SARI TOWER**  
Malaysia's gyro tower stands at a height of 110m and revolves 360 degrees, providing a panoramic view of Bandar Melaka. Its name is inspired by Keris Taming Sari, the mythical weapon belonging to the legendary Malay warrior, Hang Tuah. Attached to the tower are five commercial outlets including a restaurant, café and souvenir outlets.

**MELAKA DUCK TOURS**  
This tour takes visitors around Melaka's coastline by land and sea on an amphibian. This is also the first and the only such tour in Malaysia. Passengers (called 'ducks') get to sail the Straits of Malacca up to Pulau Melaka (Melaka Island) and enjoy impressive views of the Floating Mosque and the Melaka Marina.



**PRISON MUSEUM**  
Housed in an actual former prison, this museum chronicles the beginning of a prison system in the country and its development over the years. It also creates awareness on the prisons' role in rehabilitating offenders. The museum was set up after the Banda Hilir Prison was vacated in 2010. A visit here gives the rare opportunity of entering prison cells and viewing objects such as inmates' uniforms, canes and the hangman's noose. Particularly interesting is the façade of Pudu Jail, relocated from Kuala Lumpur, after the jail was demolished.

**ENCORE MELAKA**  
A showcase of Melaka's heritage and culture, Encore Melaka presents fascinating performances through a series of touching local life stories. The 70-minute show chronicles the historic city, from the stories of the early voyagers to the birth of modern Melaka, through songs and performances. Encore Melaka is touted to be Southeast Asia's largest permanent show theater that boasts innovative and stunning video projection mapping with a multi-stage hydraulic set with advance lighting. It also features a 360-degree rotating audience platform.



**SUBMARINE MUSEUM**  
Located at Dataran 1Malaysia in Klebang, Melaka's Submarine Museum is the first and only submarine museum in Malaysia. The 'museum' is actually a decommissioned Agosta 70 class submarine named SMID Quessant from France. Measuring 67.57 m in length, it was previously used to train submarine crew in Malaysia. In its heyday, it was widely regarded as a formidable weapon.

**HANG TUAH CENTRE**  
Hang Tuah Centre chronicles the life of Hang Tuah, the legendary Malay warrior, as told by the Malay Annals and Hikayat Hang Tuah. The complex comprises a cluster of five traditional Malaccan Malay houses representing the five famous warriors during the era of Sultan Mansur Shah – Hang Tuah, Hang Jebat, Hang Kasturi, Hang Lekir and Hang Lekiu. The centre is located in Kampung Sungai Duyong, where Hang Tuah was born.

**THE SHORE SKY TOWER**  
Situated in the vicinity of tourist attractions such as Kampung Morten, this is a great place to enjoy the view of Melaka city by day and night. Standing 163 m high, Sky Tower is the tallest building in Melaka. Visitors can enjoy a panoramic view from the observation deck situated on the 43rd floor. The glass-bottomed deck is not for the faint-hearted and provides a thrilling experience. Sky Tower is located at The Shore, a development consisting of hotels, a shopping mall and residential towers.



**MELAKA TROPICAL FRUIT FARM**  
Try out a huge variety of fresh tropical fruits including the durian, rambutan and mangosteen at the Melaka Tropical Fruit Farm. Sprawling over 173 acres of land in Sungai Udang, the farm caters to family visits with facilities for cycling, kayaking and fishing. A mini zoo with camels, ostriches, deer and various other animals can also be found here.
